**RE: Your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000**

I write in response to your Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('FoIA 2000') request dated **24/09/2020**, in which you requested:

- "1. Where does "Fast Track Programme training" take place? As far as I know, its training is both on College of Policing and police officer's own police force? Is that right?
2. Is there any specific name of training center at College of Policing?
3. Could you break down the training contents by training center? For example, What kind of subject is taught at College of Policing? And What kind of course is taught at police force?"

When a request for information is made under the FoIA 2000, a public authority has a general duty under section 1(1) of the Act to inform an applicant whether the requested information is held. There is then a general obligation to communicate that information to the applicant.

Under section 1(1), I can confirm **some information is held**. We have dealt with each part of your request below:

- 1. Where does "Fast Track Programme training" take place? As far as I know, its training is both on College of Policing and police officer's own police force? Is that right?**

Recorded information held. The overwhelming majority of Fast Track training is provided in force. A few modules take place at College of Policing sites.

- 2. Is there any specific name of training center at College of Policing?**

No recorded information held, but for context, there are no specific names for training centres.

- 3. Could you break down the training contents by training center? For example, What kind of subject is taught at College of Policing? And What kind of course is taught at police force?**

Recorded information held.

The programme is comprised of a blend of national core learning products, which are delivered by police forces, such as:

- The Initial Police Learning and Development Programme (IPLDP)
- The Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship (PCDA)
- Degree-holder entry programme (DHEP)
- Pre-join degree
- Core Leadership Programme (CLP); and
- National Policing Promotion Framework (NPPF), which are set by the College and delivered in force.

Furthermore, a series of Fast Track cohort modules are also delivered by the College. These modules deliver leadership related learning outcomes, which exceed the scope of the CLP.

The Fast Track modules are:

- Managing Self and Others
- Evidence Based Practice, Creativity and Innovation
- Collective Leadership, Organisational Change and Strategic Vision
- Valuing Difference and Inclusion
- Business Acumen, Partnership Working and Political Astuteness.
